Welcome to the Covid Vaccine second issue of our Practice Newsletter. In this Newsletter, we aim to provide patients with up to date news, changes to the services we provide and useful information.

✗ COVID vaccine update

We are very proud to be a part of the largest vaccination programme of our time. Our staff have been working tirelessly alongside nine other practices across our district to deliver vaccinations at the Civic Centre in Castleford. Below is a brief overview of where we are up to with the programme.

Home visiting team

We have a fantastic Home visiting team made up of nursing staff and admin staff from several surgeries that have done a fantastic job at delivering vaccinations to all care homes, learning disability homes and housebound patients.

They have completed all second doses at the care homes and learning disability homes as well as first doses of all housebound patients across Knottingley, Eggborough, Ferrybridge, Pontefract and Castleford. They have started some 2nd doses for housebound patients too. This has been an absolutely huge task to coordinate and we would like to thank them for all their hard work and dedication to ensure these patients are done as quickly as possible.

1st Dose Vaccinations

We have contacted at least on two occasions, all patients in the top nine cohorts for their first vaccine, which are:

- 1. Residents in a care home for older adults and their carers
- 2. All those 80 years of age and over and frontline health and social care workers
- 3. All those 75 years of age and over
- 4. All those 70 years of age and over and clinically extremely vulnerable individuals
- 5. All those 65 years of age and over
- 6. All individuals aged 16 years to 64 years with underlying health conditions which put them at higher risk of serious disease and mortality
- 7. All those 60 years of age and over
- 8. All those 55 years of age and over
- 9. All those 50 years of age and over

We have now moved onto the next cohort

- 10. All those aged 40-49 years of age
- 11. All those aged 30-39 years of age
- 12. All those aged 18-29 years of age

We ask that if you wish to decline your vaccination that you let us know by following the link on the text message, by telephone 01977 673141 or via email Ashgrove.Medicalcentre@nhs.net this will ensure that we no longer send you reminder messages and also helps us to drop to the next cohort.

We are now working through those patients who are immunosuppressed to invite their household contacts over 18 years to be invited as per the latest government guidelines.

2nd dose vaccinations

We are allocated 2nd doses of both Pfizer and AstraZenica based on 1st doses given between 10-12 weeks previously.

We have contacted all patients who had their first dose of the Pfizer vaccine on or before the 3rd February 2021, and all first doses of the AstraZenica vaccines given on or before 31st January 2021

We ask that if you've not spoken to a member of staff or received a text message to please get in touch so we can arrange your second vaccine

Under 30s AstraZeneca advice

New guidance has been issued for the use of the Oxford AstraZeneca Covid-19 vaccine.

This follows further reviews by the independent regulator, the MHRA, and the Commission for Human Medicines, of a very small number of people in the UK who have developed a rare blood-clotting condition since having the Oxford AstraZeneca Covid-19 vaccine.

The MHRA and Joint Committee for Vaccinations and Immunisations have emphasised that the risk of this condition is extremely small and that the benefits of the vaccine outweigh the risks for the vast majority of people. They have recommended that:

- Everyone who has had the AstraZeneca vaccine should still have a second dose of the AstraZeneca vaccine, irrespective of age, unless they suffered any serious side effects after their first vaccination
- People aged 30 and over or who have a health condition that puts them at higher risk of severe Covid-19 disease should still be offered the Oxford AstraZeneca vaccine. The benefits in protecting them against the serious consequences of COVID-19 outweigh any risk of this rare condition
- People aged 18-29 who do not have a health condition that puts them at higher risk of severe Covid-19 disease will be offered an alternative Covid-19 vaccine where available. (This has been recommended as a precaution as people under 30 are at less risk from Covid-19 and not because they are considered to be at particular risk of developing the rare blood clot)

 People under 30 can still choose to have the Oxford AstraZeneca vaccine if this will mean they can be protected more quickly and they have been made aware of the guidance

Further vaccine information

As with the rest of the country, 1st dose vaccines have been slowed down through April. However, we will still be receiving 2nd doses of both Pfizer and AstraZenica so you will be invited when it's your turn.

Further to the government announcement regarding COVID passports we have no more information on this and as soon as we know anything we will update patients.

Moderna Vaccine

The Moderna vaccine has now been approved for use within the UK. We have not been told so far when our first delivery of the vaccine will be available to us. All staff who are involved with the delivery of vaccines have already done their training for the Moderna vaccine so will be ready when it arrives.

This will be a two dose vaccine, which will be scheduled between 10-12 weeks a part
